



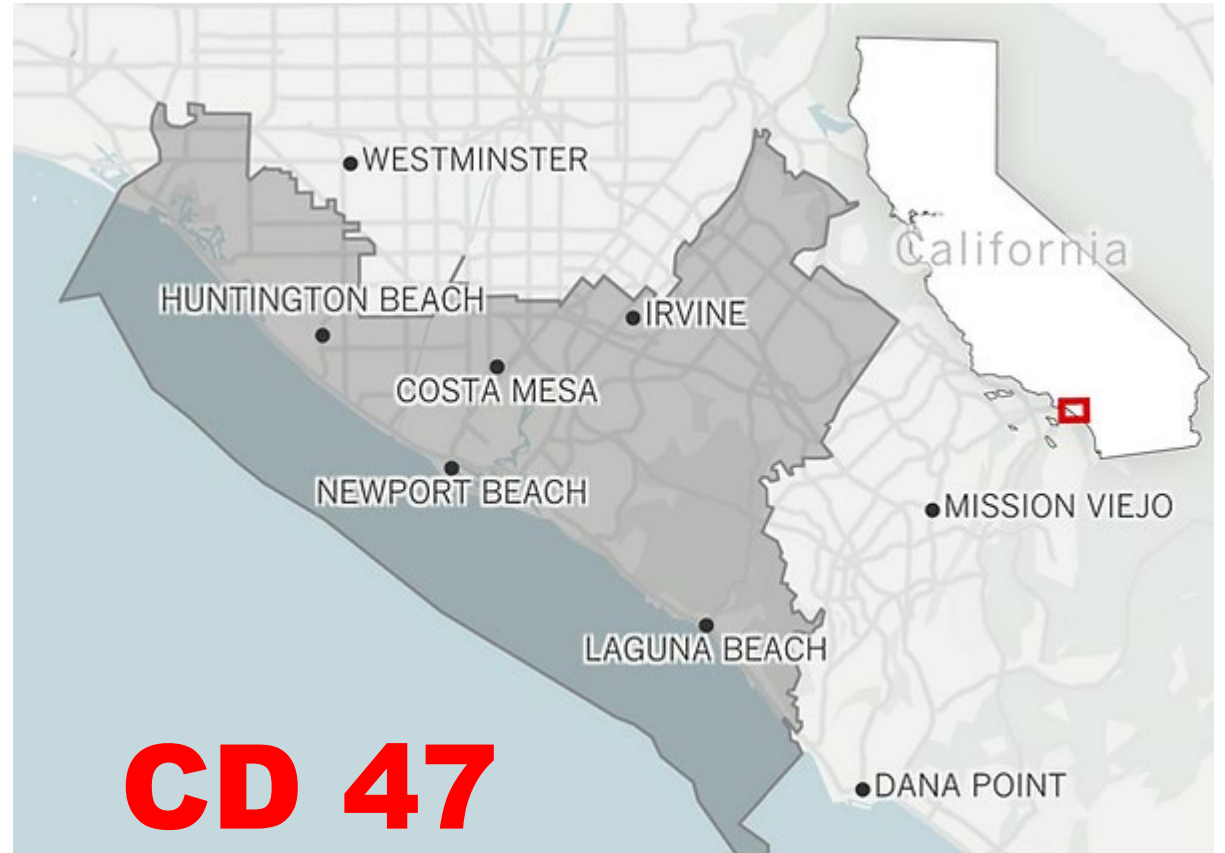

CRA's 14 Principles

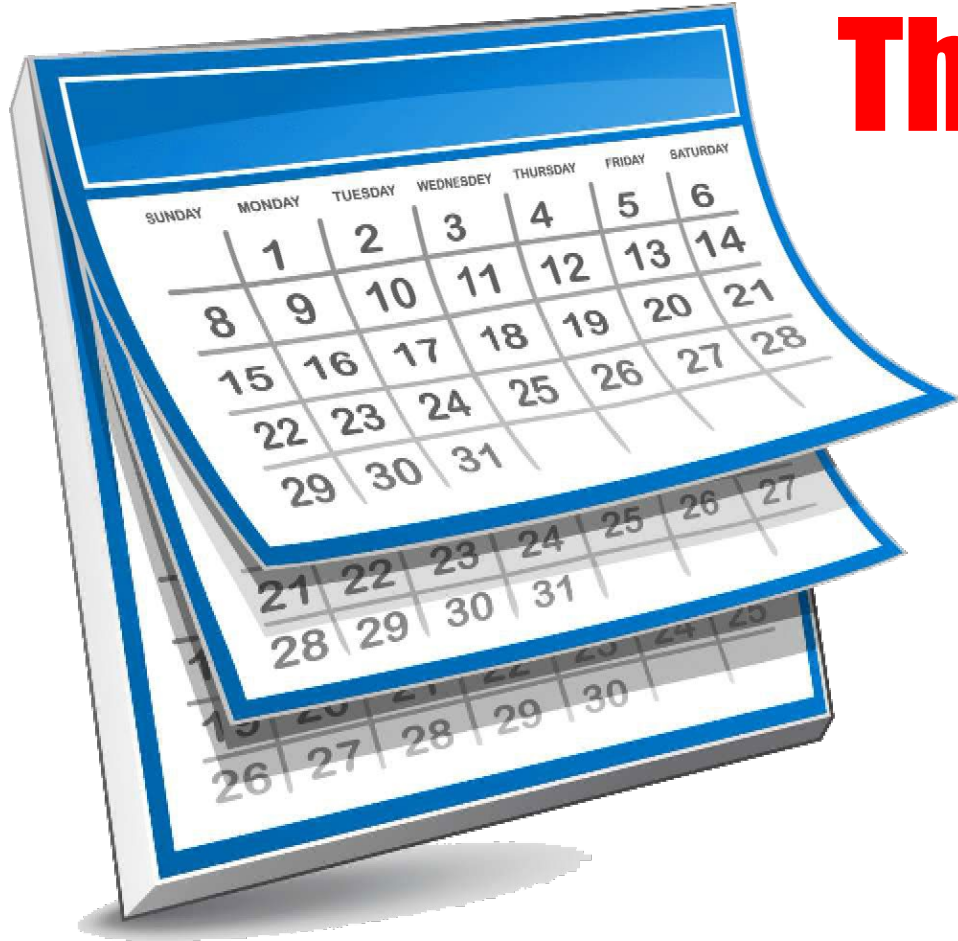
1. **Judeo-Christian Foundation** namely the moral law of the Bible
2. **Inalienable Rights** come from Creator and can't be taken by man.
3. **Self-Government** first, then family, community, state, and nation.
4. **Education** for all with parental choice.
5. **Taxes** should move from income to sales and/or use based.
6. **Free Enterprise** is best.
7. **Family** the man-woman family should be supported by government policy.

CRA's 14 Principles (cont'd)

8. **Sanctity of Life** preborn child's right to life must be protected.
9. **National Defense** strong, consistent, seeking victory over tyranny.
10. **Right to Bear Arms** supported without qualification.
11. **Victims' Rights** should take priority over criminal rights.
12. **Term Limitation** support not as an ideal but as a necessity.
13. **National Sovereignty** America first, not protectionism but fair trade.
14. **Decentralized Government** favoring self and small government.

Proposed New Three Principle Statement

- **The Law of Nature and Nature's God is supreme**, including the protection of innocent human life, the institution of marriage and equal protection under the law.
- **Government should be limited** and decentralized, with checks and balances and the consent of the governed through honest elections.
- **The economic system should be one of private property, and free enterprise**, with sanctity of contract, sound money, equal weights and measures, and limitation of public and private debt.

HB Measures – March Primary

- Shall proposed Charter Amendment No.1, which provides that commencing in 2026, for all municipal **elections**, the City: may require Voter ID for elections; provide more in-person voting locations; and monitor ballot drop boxes, be approved?
- Shall proposed Charter Amendment No.2, which provides that the only **flags** to be displayed by the City on City property are the United States Flag, the County of Orange Flag, the City of Huntington Beach Flag, the POW-MIA Flag, the six Armed Forces Flags, the Olympic Flag during the Summer Olympic Games, and any other flag if authorized by a unanimous vote of the City Council, be approved?
- Shall proposed Charter Amendment No.3 to: commencing in 2026, require the City to adopt a two-year **budget**; update the procedures to **cancel** a regular City Council meeting; update the process to fill a City Council **vacancy**; and amend outdated phrases, syntax, dates, pronouns, and titles be approved?

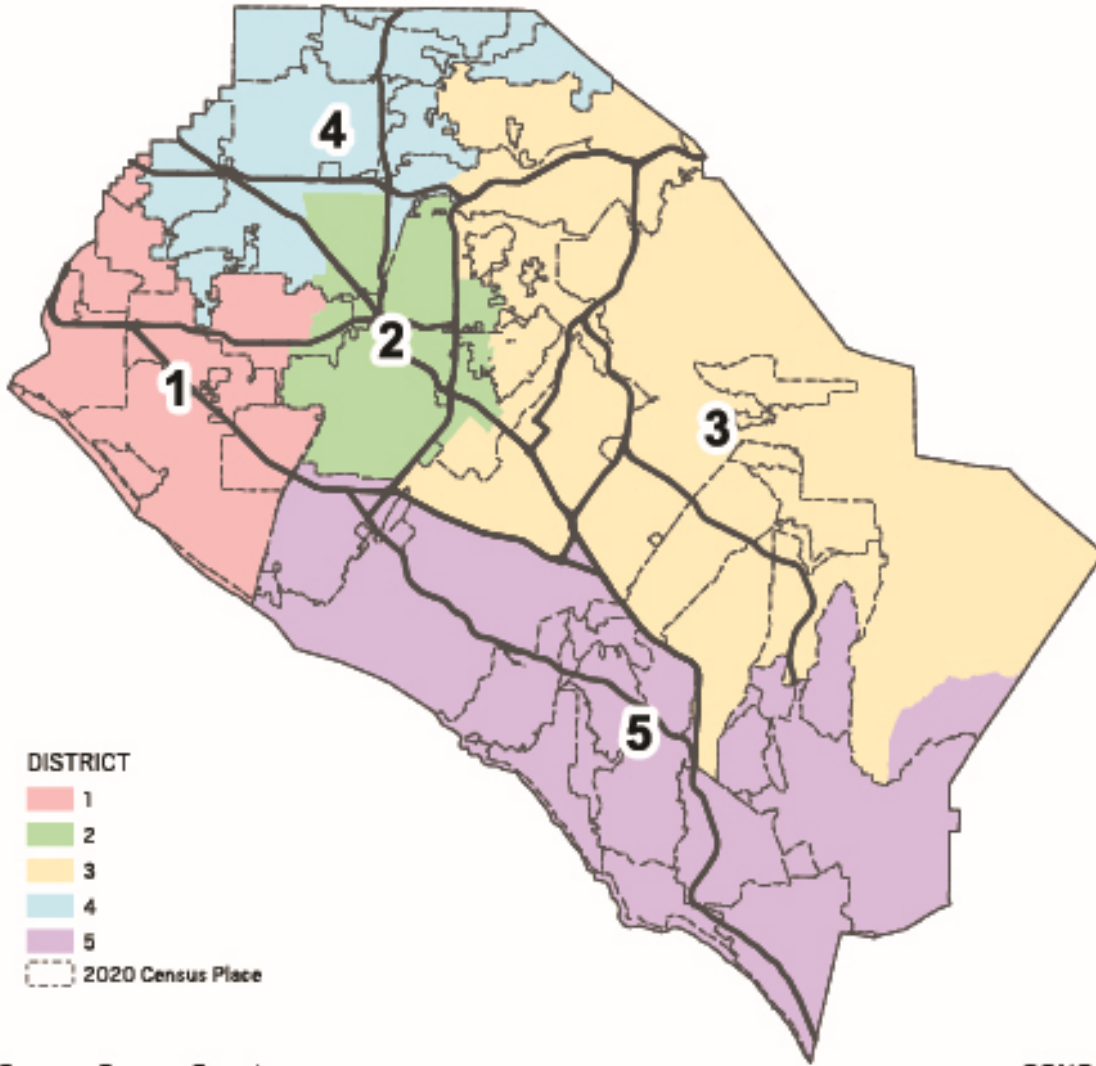

If Nguyen wins in Primary or General Election in 2024, her normal SD 36 term ends in 2026, and she would take the Supervisor office Jan 2025, creating Senate vacancy

Would require special SD 36 election in 2025.
